Second Episcopal District Lay Organization 17th Convention Social Justice: Empowering The People "Laity walking humbly with God to do justice and to love kindness" Micah 6:8

To our Western North Carolina Lay Organization members, I am submitting this report of service as an elected alternate-delegate to this convention.

The convention was held at the Marriott Hotel in Newport News, Va. on September 27-29, 2018. Our delegation consisted of twenty people who cast votes for electing new officers for 2019-2020.

Our Connectional Chaplin, Sister Pamela Jones-Watford ushered us into our Worship experiences with songs – This is the Day and Hallelujah – This Praise Belongs to You. Our welcome and administrative business enabled us to settle down and hear what GOD was saying in the preached word. With power and boldness, Pastor William LeMar (Metropolitan AME, Washington, NC) used the <u>Message Version</u> of Amos 5:21-24 to cry out loud a message of "The Church That GOD Can't Stand". Rev. LeMar reflected and challenged us to use heads and hearts to examine how we as present day folks go through, by habit and ritual, the planned and unplanned business; i.e. making sure the church, official board, quarterly conferences are held; annual conferences with pomp and circumstance, etc.

These activities represent a people concerned more about order, time, and assignment than what God's will and purpose is for HIS people. He said, Amos, a herdsman, was used by God to speak truth to power – reminding people of their self-conceitedness. Rev. LeMar, also shared when he visited each Annual Conference this past year he could not find an Amos with the message Amos was concerned about many ages ago.

He reminded us today beware of e-mails, cell phones, cross wearing medals, be careful of preachers and prophets who have to tell us who they are, stay away from people who fight, compete, and argue about stuff while looking for the big church appointment; don't trust people or preachers who don't smell like sheep. His reminder cautioned the Laity to remain true to our GOD ... and be real!

Remember Amos was GOD's offering to the church for serving the sheep. We are on assignment for an appointment to be radically independent of the church to say what is right. We must stand tall and bold, not accepting status quo mentality; and step out to speak about justice in doing what the Lord commands.

His closing statement was follow the spirit's lead with strong resolve of "A Charge to Keep and I have a GOD to glorify! ... Help me Lord to watch and pray and on you rely!

Registration, Credential, Candidates' forum, Election of District Officers, Constitution-By Laws, Awards' Activities for Connectional Leader Valerie Gary-Bell and 2nd Episcopal Leaders, Social Action, etc. were completed with success.
